## Timeline of Selected Events

Shri Mataji travelled throughout her life and during the period from 1970 through to the early 2000s she traveled continuously, offering free public lectures and the experience of self-realization to all. She enabled people to pass this valuable experience on to others, as well as the technique necessary to sustain it, known as Sahaja Yoga meditation.

Here is a condensed sample of events in which she played an instrumental role.

Born on the 21st March in Chhindwara, India

Birth of second daughter, Sadhana

#### 1961

Launched the 'Youth Society for Films' and was a member of the Film Censor Board in Mumbai, India

Husband, C.P. Srivastava becomes joint Private Secretary to Indian Prime Minister Lal Bahadur Shastri

# 1966

Husband, C.P. Srivastava becomes head of Shipping Corporation of India

# 1970

Opening of the Sahasrara Chakra on the 5th of May in Nargol, India, making it possible for the first time in the history of spirituality for people to receive self-realization en masse First international Sahaja Yoga event in Tehran, Iran

#### 1971

Establishment of Sahaja Yoga

#### 1972

Travels from India to USA by ship

# 1973

First Sahaja Yoga public program in Dhulia, India

## 1974

Husband, C.P. Srivastava becomes Secretary-General of the International Maritime Organisation headquartered in London, UK Family moves to London

#### 1977

First official audio recording of Shri Mataji's talks begin in India followed by England First Sahaja Yoga public program outside of India at Caxton Hall, London on Oct 20th 1977

First Sahaja Yoga weekend seminar outside of India at Easthampstead Park, Berkshire, UK on 14th/15th Oct 1978

First international seminar of Sahaja Yoga in Ganapatipule, India

Awarded 'Personality of the Year' by the Italian Government

#### 1987

Travels to the USSR to introduce Sahaja Yoga via public programs

#### 1989

Travels to South America to introduce Sahaja Yoga via public programs

#### 1990

First program for United Nations staff in New York
Husband, C.P. Srivastava knighted by Queen Elizabeth II in England
Addresses the Medical Conference in Moscow
Establishment of Sahaja Yoga International School in Dharamshala, India

Moves to Cabella Ligure, Italy

First Royal Albert Hall public program in London

Appointed as Honorary Member of the Petrovskaya Academy of Art and Science, St. Petersburg, Russia

#### 1995

Speaks at UN conference in Beijing "Meta Modern Era" book published

#### 1996

Travels to Cairo, Egypt Sahaja Yoga Health Centre opens in Belapur, India

Establishment of 'Loving Hands' NGO for destitute women and children in Delhi, India Large public program in US at the Cathedral of St John the Divine, New York

Addresses Medical Conference in Italy Addresses Science Conference in Russia

Establishes Music & Arts Academy in Vaitarna, India

# 2008

Addresses a large seminar in northern Italy, the most recent of approx 3,000 recorded talks Travels to Vienna to inaugurate Nirmal Prasht National Centre

Travels for the last time to India for Diwali celebrations Celebrates Christmas by hosting an international seminar in Genoa, Italy
